BUT..! What if your Godparents could choose you?

That might be...kind of cool, huh?

Welcome to the world of ***"THE FAIRLY ODDPARENTS!"***

An animated series about a young boy who needs help and the two magical beings who - POOF!" - come to his aid. Whether it's an overbearing baby-sitter, a tough homework assignment, wanting only ice cream for dinner, or just a plain old rainy day, "The Fairly OddParents" fly to the rescue and magically make everything just a little bit better.

Then they screw it up.

WHAT THE HECK IS A “FAIRLY ODDPARENT?”

Everyone’s heard of “Fairy Godparents”, right?

In this case, our Fairy Godparents are a bit on the eccentric/ goofball side. So, even though they refer to themselves as “Fairy Godparents”, to the casual observer they’re “Fairly Odd” indeed.

Besides, “The Fairly OddParents” is a much catchier title for a show than “The Fairy Godparents who are Kinda Nutty!” don’t you think?

TIMMY TURNER

Timmy's a ten-year-old all-American boy with buck teeth who just so-happens to wear a pink baseball cap.

He's the star of our show. The nucleus. The center. Without him, the Godparents wouldn't be here and we wouldn't have any fun now, would we?

Timmy's an only child. Flying solo. When you're a kid this can be a very big deal. You sort of have to be your own best friend. Think about it. No older sister to advise you, no younger brother to push around. You're completely on your own. sometimes it's cool, sometimes it's scary.

Oh, sure, Timmy's got a Mom and Dad but they're ...you know...*Mom and Dad!* they don't understand him! They're...(insert horror music sting here)...Adults!!!

Timmy is at that point in every kid's life where he is dependent on every adult around him. Not old enough to do anything legally except ride a bike and go to school. It can make a smart kid like Timmy feel quite powerless at times, especially when left in the clutches of his supercilious baby-sitter- Vicky.

This is the reason the Fairy Godparents came into his life. They saw a kid in need of some emotional help and just "popped" into his world one day! They have definitely become the magic shoulder he needs to cry on, should the need ever arise.

Timmy's a very bright little guy. He's Way smarter than his parents and can out think nearly every other kid on the playground.

No, he's not a rocket scientist, and he'll probably never cure any major disease, but he's very savvy. Quick. Highly observant.

Hmm...you know...maybe he will cure a disease.

While these qualities may be off-putting to the other kids around him, it does enable him to communicate with adults a lot more easily. Too bad the adults in his life aren't blessed with the same abilities.

On the outside, Timmy may seem to have everything: parents that love him, Fairy Godparents that adore him, a nice house, nice brains, nice pink hat...

BUT!

Since he's only ten-years-old, and his parents go out for the occasional evening on the town, there's one thing he still needs...

A BABY-SITTER...

VICKY

"Icky" with a "V". The baby-sitter from Hell.

Just wanted to say that up front.

Everyone knows someone like Vicky. A sixteen-year-old neighborhood girl who baby-sits the local kids in order to make a few extra bucks. Seems harmless enough, right?

Wrong. This is one mean-spirited, chip-on-the-shoulder, angry-at-the-world teenager. Why is she so angry? No particular reason. Might as well ask why we need to breathe air. It's just one of those facts of life. Birds will lay eggs and Vicky will be furious. Period.

The one and only pleasure she seems to get out of life is tormenting the kids she baby-sits.

Timmy especially.

Now don't go thinking she tortures Timmy in any physical way. That would be just flat out mean and since we're on Nickelodeon, and know we could never get away with it anyway, why try?

Vicky's much more adept at tormenting Timmy *psychologically*. It's a lot more fun and leaves no physical marks.

With her large cache' of blackmail items- i.e. Girlie magazines with Timmy's fingerprints on them, phony bad report cards with Timmy's name on them, computer-doctored photos of Timmy perpetrating any number of petty crimes, etc. - she has no trouble in "persuading" Timmy to do her bidding.

Do Timmy's parents suspect that they're leaving their only child in the hands of a conniving, self-serving harpy?

Heavens no!! When Mr. and Ms. Turner are around, Vicky is the sweetest thing in the world! An angel sent from above! Mother Teresa and Princess Di reincarnated! A real peach.

Only Timmy and his Fairy Godparents know how rotten this peach really is.

THE FAIRLY ODDPARENTS!

Timmy's two magic pals! They got crowns! They got wings! They got magic wands! They got personality! What don't they got?

Any idea what they're doing. That's what.

Now we're not saying they're *complete* idiots- you know, the kind that drool and wet themselves- like politicians - it's just that they occasionally make mistakes. But, when you're dealing with two all-powerful, magic beings, a simple little blunder can quite often wind up nearly destroying the universe! (Or, at the very least, Dad's new car).

Yet, for the many mistakes they do make, they've managed to do an awful lot of good for Timmy and that's all that counts.

They're here to help Timmy and Timmy alone. If it enhances Timmy's life, it's okay with them. He's their assignment. Their responsibility. It's up to them to make him happy if that's what he wants.

And what Timmy wants is what really controls the Godparents' behavior.

BUT..!

Even though the Godparents are magic, and have been around for a very long, LONG time, they still behave as though they were born the very minute they entered Timmy's life.

Heck, they're magic. Maybe they were.

Everything in Timmy's world is new to them. It's all a fresh experience. A new adventure. And their dinner plate-sized eyes are wide open to it all.

This is one of the reasons Timmy can relate to them so well.

They actually think like kids.

COSMO!

Timmy's green-haired Fairy Godfather who talks like a game show host on sixty-eight cups of coffee.

He's a magical whirlwind of energy who is just dying to show Timmy a good time!

Always well-dressed for the occasion (he regularly wears a necktie) Cosmo constantly sees the glass as half-full and continuously has a rim shot joke at the ready.

Naturally endowed with a great sense of fun, Cosmo is the first one who'll impulsively go along with Timmy's wishes whether the wish in question is a wise move or not.

That's the essence of Cosmo: Fun first. Ask questions later.

Cosmo really digs being magic- (who wouldn't?) - and wants everyone else to enjoy the experience along with him. He thinks it's all so cool. And it is.

But Cosmo...well...he *isn't* cool. He's the furthest thing from "cool".

He's a major geek with wings and a magic wand.

Yeah, he's got the wings. He's got the wand. But, he ain't exactly got the imagination. He's got the tools, but not the talent.

In the business of Godparenting, this can be a major sticking point.

Yet, with power like this at his disposal, it's a good thing Cosmo is a nice, really stupid kinda guy who doesn't have a mean, bone in his little tiny magical body.

All he really wants is for Timmy to have a good time and be able to go along with him for the ride.

WANDA!

She's got a pink "Wilma Flinstone" hairstyle, a "Carol Burnett" laugh you can't forget, and is never caught without her make-up.

She's Timmy's Fairy Godmother and Cosmo's wife.

Wanda's there to provide the strong female "Rock of Gibraltar" that these two boys are suppose to attach their emotional anchors to.

The only problem is, on occasion, she behaves like just as much of a kid as they do.

She needs to have fun too, you know! But the difference between her and Cosmo is that she knows when to quit. She's a little on the wacky side, sure, and enjoys a good time as much as the next fairy, but, compared to Cosmo, she's the most stable, reasonable being in the galaxy!

She's technically an adult, yes, due to her many years spent living in the universe, but like Cosmo, the exact second she entered Timmy's world, she seemed to have the vitality and spunk of a kid who is just seeing the big city for the first time!

Wanda really loves being magic. It makes her day a lot easier.

Timmy's sad? "POOF!" Problem solved. Cosmo's depressed? "ZOINK!" Cheer up, dude! Mascara runny? "DOINK!" Max Factor to the..uh..max.

As a Fairy Godparent, Timmy is her responsibility. She's gotta make sure he's happy and well taken care of.

But, sometimes, Cosmo's screw-ups end up taking all of her attention and, to her chagrin, Timmy must take a back seat until she can get the problem straightened out. She figures that it's better to help the guy with the all-powerful magic wand first, and then help the harmless little boy.

She's one mother of a Godmother. Even though she could turn you into a frog.

JORGREN VON STRANGLE

***Insert heavy footsteps here.**

“Welcome to Ze Fairy Academy!”

These words strike fear and utter terror into the hearts of fairies and magic folk throughout the galaxy!

Meet Jorgen Von Strangle. A mammoth, muscular mountain of a fairy who’s the head drill instructor at The Fairy Academy.

(Think: Arnold Schwarzenegger with the power to destroy the galaxy. Wait, Arnie already has that- just think of him with a tiny, little fairy crown on his head.)

With his battle-ready Laser Wand and Hyper-Drive-Nuclear-Accelerated Jetpack- c’mon, fairy wings are way too girly! - Jorgen is ready to dispense some serious magic on the unfortunate fairy trainees who find themselves unlucky enough to land under his command!

Hating the term “fairy” and preferring to be called a “Magic Marine”, Jorgen has made it his mission in life to instill discipline, respect, and above all else, “fairy pride” in his recruits. (“Fairy” is good enough for *them*, just not him.) Standing nearly ten-feet-tall and having biceps the size of small European countries certainly helps him achieve his goal.

Does Jorgen want to help make a good name for fairies everywhere, or does he just love torturing the tiny little creatures he despises?

DUH!

But, intimidating as he may be, beneath that immense chest beats the warm, loving heart of a truly swell guy.

(I had to write that last part ‘cuz he’s got his wand pointed at my head).

MR. AND MS. TURNER

Timmy's loving, yet slightly... hmm.. wait ...COMPLETELY oblivious parents.

Dad wears a suit. Mom wears a skirt. He has an enthusiastic, deep voice. She has a sultry, slightly daffy one.

Oh sure, we'll see their ears, noses, eye, mouth, hair, eyebrows and teeth...just never at the same time.

(Why? Just 'cuz it's kinda neat and it worked on "Home Improvement". Plus, we can have one of those Nickelodeon Contests someday. You know, a "What do you think Timmy's Parents look like?" sorta thing.)

Mr. and Ms. Turner are crazy about each other and their son. To them, life is perfect. Great jobs, great house, great son, great everything. They do everything together and never seem to get sick of each other.

However, sometimes their enthusiasm for life, and their determination to show themselves and Timmy a good time eclipses the complex emotional needs of their only son.

Don't misunderstand. Timmy's parents love him very much. Too much in fact. Being a bit on the outlandish side, they constantly want to include him in their unusual activities.

Whether it's attending the "Save the Sprinkler" foundation meetings once a week, or the annual "Plunger Festival" their behavior has provided ample evidence that they're the last place Timmy should go if he's in need of serious help or advice.

They're nice, they're fun, and the really dig their son. But they don't know that Cosmo and Wanda exist.

And they never will.

DA RULES

Superman! (Got your attention didn't I?)

Superman had Kryptonite.

The Fairly OddParents have Da Rules.

When you have a character like Superman - a guy that can do anything - you have to give him some sort of limitation. That's the only way to make the stories interesting. That's where Kryptonite comes in.

And Superman's been around for sixty years.

Cosmo and Wanda have "Da Rules".

"Da Rules" is a book of rules. A book of rules that the Godparents have to follow. It's part of their job. Their "how-to" manual. And part of the whole "Godparent package".

It's a text that dictates their every move and *severely* confines their amazing magical abilities, "Da Rules" limits them in the way that Kryptonite limits Superman.

For example: Let's say Timmy asks: "Hey! Can you guys kill Vicky, chop her into little pieces, form her dripping bones into a necklace and let me wear her to school and show all my friends?"

The answer is, of course, "NO! The rules say we can't kill anyone, Timmy. Although we can embarrass people a great deal."

Just like the Genie in Disney's "Aladdin", the Godparents have many things they're able to do, but Da Rules present an equal number of things they're simply just not allowed to do.

See, it's no *fun* if Timmy gets to do anything he wants. And fun is what any cartoon show should be about. You want serious? Rent "Pulp Fiction".

If Timmy could do *anything*, we'd hate him, not care, and watch something on the "Disney Channel". And we all know how scary that can be.

Da Rules are what make Cosmo and Wanda behave.

Let's face it...two magical beings, if made to do the bidding of a ten-year-old boy, could be quite scary indeed.

"Da Rules" are there to insure we *don't* get scary, *can't* solve every problem, and that we have a *million* stories in the future.

Also, it's a great way to show kids that following the rules is important.

OKAY, WHAT ARE SOME OF “DA RULES THE ODDPARENTS HAVE TO FOLLOW?”

Good question. Here’s a few answers...

1. Timmy can never tell anybody that the Godparents exist. If he does, they have to go away forever.
2. Nobody can ever find out *on their own* that the Godparents exist. If this happens, they also have to go away forever.
3. Can’t instantly solve problems for Timmy, but they *can* help him find the right solutions himself. For example: a math test. They can’t give him all the answers, but they can set up a lunch meeting with Albert Einstein.
4. Can’t hurt/ kill anybody.
5. Can’t force anybody to like Timmy. But they can help Timmy enroll in Charm School.
6. Timmy has to actually wish for anything major. “I wish I could...” For example: If the story centers on Timmy wanting to be an astronaut, he has to say, “I wish I could be an astronaut!”. The Godparents, from this point, are allowed to assist him with ideas of their own, i.e. a Pink Space Helmet, a Paisley Space Capsule, etc. See, even through Timmy may wish for something specific, they may take it upon themselves to “enhance” his wish, thinking he’ll like their solution better than his own. But Timmy, with his wishes, has to actually “get the magic ball rolling”.
7. Any other rules we need in order to make the story work.

**IF NOBODY IS ALLOWED TO EVER SEE THE ODDPARENTS
WITH TIMMY, HOW DO THEY KEEP TABS ON THE KID?**

Easy. They disguise themselves as goldfish, and live in a bowl in Timmy's bedroom. They can turn into any pet they want, sure, but they just really seem to enjoy the water.

“THE FAIRLY ODDPARENTS” - A BRIEF SERIES OVERVIEW

“THE FAIRLY ODDPARENTS” is a show about Timmy. Period.

None of this would be happening if Timmy didn't exist.

Yet, Timmy wouldn't exist- as anybody interesting, at least - if the OddParents weren't around.

A Catch-22 if ever there was one.

Timmy and the OddParents need each other. And we, as the audience, need them to need each other.

Without the OddParents, we'd just have a show about a kid. *Not that there's anything wrong with that.* But, honestly, there's a million shows about “just kids” and we're trying to be a bit different here.

We've got ourselves an ordinary kid here, but not only does he have more on the ball than the average kid, he also has a HUMONGOUS edge on life. He's got his own magical police force and he's not afraid to use it! (Magic Keystone Cops is more like it, but, we don't wanna hurt anybody's feelings).

“The Fairly OddParents” is a show about friendship more than anything. Timmy's a kid who needs friends he can relate to and the OddParents provide that friendship for Timmy by, not only being there when he needs them, but their very existence, while seemingly impossible, definitely arouses the interest, and hope, in a kid as smart and imaginative as Timmy.

They fuel his brain and make him look forward to the next day.

The premise of “The Fairly OddParents” is extremely strong, and the remarkably powerful character personalities will furnish anything else we need in the way of comedic narrative.

Let's face it, having a numerous amount of story ideas is great, but, if you've got great, fleshed-out characters on top of that, you're truly blessed with a wishing well of great entertainment possibilities.

WHY WILL KIDS WANT TO WATCH “THE FAIRLY ODDPARENTS”?

Three reasons:

1. A kid is the star.
2. He has two magic pals.
3. Every damn kid out there is gonna wonder what they would wish for if they had Cosmo and Wanda at their disposal.

C’mon...you’re already kinda wondering what *you’d* do, ain’t ya?

INCIDENTAL CHARACTERS

TOOTIE- Vicky's eight- year -old little sister. Irresistibly cute with her giant glasses and tiny pig tails, she is the exact opposite of her mean-spirited older sister. We meet her for the first time in "The Fairy Flu" episode. She's completely in love with Timmy, and makes no bones about trying to snatch him up and cover him with as many smooches as she can. Timmy, of course, wants nothing to do with her and thinks she's one huge "cootie" with spectacles.

JEFF THE ELF- A @\$%&*@! pissed- off elf who works for @\$%&! Santa Clause and totally @\$%&* hates every @\$%&! second of it. First introduced in "The Temp!" episode, Jeff is constantly trying to convince Santa that he has a name! An identity! He's not just another pointy- eared worker bee! Since Santa refuses to believe Jeff is anything other than an elf who makes toys, Jeff must escape the clutches of Kringle and find a life for himself in the outside world! And to do so, he is constantly trying to enlist the help of Timmy and the OddParents.

TRIXIE TANG - The hottest babe in Timmy's school. An incredibly gorgeous Asian-American cutie, Trixie is able to reduce Timmy and the rest of the sixth-grade boys to groveling third-graders with the bat of one well-manicured eyelash. She, of course, has no idea Timmy was ever born and wants nothing less than to completely rule the school.

THE SQUIRRELY SCOUTS- Timmy's scout troop. First seen in the episode, "Scout's Honor". A gang of little do-gooders who rush in psychotic mobs toward every helpless old lady and attempt to help them across the street, regardless of whether they actually *want* to cross or not! Yes, they mean well, but as these contentious young men have yet to learn, it's easy to kill with kindness if you're not careful. Timmy's the worst of the bunch: he actually has all 5,000 Squirrely Scout merit badges!

THE CREAMPUFFS- An unfortunate group of sweet little girl scouts that have Vicky as their camp counselor. However, under her supremely “influential” guidance in the cookie-selling department, they manage to outsell their nearest competitor eight to one. You can also see them in the “Scout’s Honor” episode.

THE TOOTH FAIRY- The most popular (and phony baloney) fairy in the universe. First seen in “The Zappy’s” episode. From endorsement deals, to charitable causes, no fairy can touch her when it comes to P.R. Cosmo thinks she’s hot, Wanda hates her guts. She’s rumored to be dating Jorgen Von Strangle. He does have nice teeth, after all.

SANTA CLAUS- C’mon. It’s Santa Clause. Red suit. Beard. Big bag of ...of what? As far as Jeff and the rest of the elves are concerned, it’s a bag filled with misery! But, hey, Santa’s gotta get the toys made somehow, right? I guess you might say, in the world of “The Fairly OddParents” Santa is an oblivious, yet well-meaning slave driver. You can see Santa in “The Temp” episode, as well as a small cameo in “The Zappy’s”.

WIZZY- The fairy host “F tv” - “Fairy Television” - Wizzy is one hip, energetic English fairy with a real gift for getting the right interview at the right time! His list of magical big shot friends is long indeed and he gets invited to every single “who’s who” party in the universe! If you want to make it in the fairy biz, it’s a good idea to get Wizzy on your side. Check him out in “The Zappy’s episode.

BRUNO DELVECCHIO- The toughest kid in school. Never smiles. Never bathes. Never brushes, never flosses. Rumor has it he has a collection of missing second-graders in his locker. Constantly harassing Timmy and his pals, Bruno’s brutality is only surpassed by his complete lack of mercy for those unfortunate enough to be smaller than him.

MR. CROCKER - Timmy's teacher. A bitter guy who used to teach chemistry at the high school until he accidentally blew it up. Now, demoted to teaching elementary school, he's reached the lowest point in his life. If he could just get that one big break! That one scientific discovery that would put him back on the map! Wait! Was that Timmy Turner over there talking to his goldfish? Hmmm...maybe that bears looking into.

This guy is a cross between "Mr. Rooney"- the principal from "Ferris Bueller"- and "Walter Cornbluth"- the crazy Marine Biologist in "Splash!" You know, the guy Eugene Levy played. Basically, he's a crazed, obsessed scientist, trying to catch his student, Timmy, in the act with his Fairy Godparents.

He has no proof that they actually exist, but he'll get it.

Even if he has to blow up another school to do it.

CHESTER AND A.J. - Timmy's two best pals. Chester is a cyber -space geek who has every known comic-book and video game known to man. Timmy and A.J. are the only friends he has. Probably because they're just as much into Dungeons and Dragons and fantasy stuff as he is, only they would never admit it in public.

A.J. is an African-American kid who's the smartest youngster in school. Hoping to be the ruler of the universe someday, he is constantly studying, spouting facts and absorbing information. There's nothing he doesn't know. Except how to interact with others.

Intellectually? You can't touch him.

Socially? He's clueless.

Because of their naturally inquisitive minds, and inability to relate successfully to others, these guys are meant for each other.

And don't think that Timmy has an easy time hiding his relationship with the Godparents from them. With imaginative friends like these it's nearly impossible.

THE CRIMSON CHIN- Timmy's favorite comic-book superhero. With his mighty "Jaw of Justice" the Crimson Chin fights for truth, justice and the safety of mandibles everywhere. Check him out in the "Super Humor" episode.

TURBO TIMMY- Timmy's super-hero alter-ego. He's big, he's gold. He's Timmy with a deep voice. You can also see him in the "Super Humor" episode.

BILLY CRYSTALBALL- The worst emcee/ stand-up comedian in the entire fairy-verse. Bad jokes and bad hair. He's in "The Zappy's" episode.

EPISODES-

1. **"PARTY OF THREE"** - Timmy wants to spend an evening alone... without a babysitter! While Mom and Dad are into the idea and seem to trust Timmy, Vicky has a real problem with it! She'll get cheated out of a night's pay! While Timmy's parents are out, and Timmy is having a fun magical evening with Cosmo and Wanda, Vicky spends her time trying to get the little squirt in trouble by calling his parents to come back home every chance she gets!

2. **"WHERE'S THE WAND"** - Wanda accidentally loses her magic wand! It falls out of the window right into Vicky's lap! Vicky - not realizing the wand is *actually* magic - and wearing a Fairy Godmother costume - takes it to her high school costume dance and causes all sorts of mayhem as she "accidentally" grants the wishes of her unsuspecting classmates! It's up to Timmy and the godparents to get the wand back before Vicky realizes what she actually has her evil hands on!

3. **"TOO MANY TIMMY'S"** - Vicky shows up to baby-sit, but pretends she doesn't feel well. Timmy's parents, unable to cancel their plans, tell Vicky that Timmy will take care of her! Under protest, Timmy obeys the "injured" Vicky's every whim, then realizes it's too much to deal with!

He then wishes there were more of him and the Godparents are happy to oblige! Timmy must then keep the forty-four-and-a-half "new Timmy's" existence a secret! 'Cuz if Vicky finds out, the Godparents will have to go away forever!

4. **"THE FAIRY FLU"** - Cosmo and Wanda are sick. They've got the "Fairy Flu!" A disease that only magic folk get! It causes them to temporarily lose control of their powers! Anything can happen - and does - as Timmy is forced to bring them along to a birthday party in honor of Vicky's annoying, cootie-ridden little sister, Tootie!

5. **"THE TEMP!"** - Timmy has to deal with a "Temporary Godparent" as Cosmo and Wanda return to the Fairy Academy to get their magic licenses renewed. The guy is a twerpy dude named Jeff whose only power is the ability to create lame toys. Meanwhile, Cosmo and Wanda's supposedly "leisure" time at the Fairy Academy is ruined when their enormous drill-

instructor - Jorgen Von strangle - puts them through the fairy equivalent of Navy Seal Training. Will everyone get their lives back to normal? Will Jeff and Jorgen get their just desserts? Tune in and see.

6. **"THE ZAPPY'S"** - Ever wonder who the best Godparents of the year are? Tune in and watch "The Zappy's!" The Oscars of the Magic world. Cosmo and Wanda get nominated for best "Overall Godparenting" and bring Timmy along with them to "Planet Fairywood" for the big ceremony! Watch as Jorgen tries to take every Zappy award for himself and gets a real dressing-down from the one-and-only "Tooth Fairy"!

7. **"SUPER HUMOR"** - Timmy wants to be a super hero! What kid wouldn't? So, the Godparents help him become one! But there's so many different kinds of heroes these days, they can't decide which specific power to give him! So, after trying out a bunch of different abilities, they finally turn Timmy into "Turbo Timmy! He's got everything! Except "Super Vision" which he desperately needs to fight the giant monster threatening the city. Will he get it and win the battle? Gotta watch to find out.

8. **"SCOUT'S HONOR"** Timmy's on a camping trip with his scout troop "The Squirrely Scouts". He's out to get his final merit badge and set a new scout record! Only trouble is, he has to capture Bigfoot to do it! So the Godparents take him to the Mythical forest! It's where all the legendary creatures live! One problem: Vicky is also going camping with her scout troop - "The Creampuffs" - and she's gonna do everything in her power to scare the little twerp and ruin his trip!

9. **"THE REALLY BAD DAY!"** - The Godparents are always nice, sweet, and just darn cute aren't they? Well according to "Da Rules" - one day - every few thousand years - they get to be BAD! It's Cosmo's turn this time around and, try as he might, he hasn't the foggiest idea of how to be bad! He stinks! So Timmy wishes that Timmy could be trained by "The baddest dude in History!" Enter: Genghis Khan! Ruler of Ancient China! He takes Cosmo under his wing and turns him into one bad Fairy!

PLUS!

Let's not forget the original...the one that started it all... "Oh Yeah! Season One..."

10. **"THE FAIRLY ODDPARENTS!"** - Timmy - our ten -year-old hero- has a problem: his baby-sitter, Vicky! Good thing this kid has two magical Fairy Godparents - Cosmo and Wanda - looking out for him! They arrive on the scene and kick Vicky's butt! (Playfully, and magically, of course). Know what? They enjoy it so much that it looks like they'll hang around for a while!

EPISODE PREMISES -

“SUIT YOURSELF” - Uh oh, the fairy godparent company is a victim of a hostile corporate takeover! Money-hungry fairies - in business suits - now control everything! Cosmo and Wanda are forced to wear the company uniform! Everyone needs an electronic passcard to enter the building! And, worst of all, wishes by clients will only be allowed if approved by the company! Plus...there's an interest rate!!! These changes are affecting fairies everywhere! Even Jorgen is being forced to conform to the new regime's standards! And, believe me, he's not happy about having to wear a tie!!

“GO FISH” - Cosmo and Wanda are being a little bit *too* annoying to Timmy one morning. They keep wanting to play while Timmy is frantically trying to finish his homework! Timmy, finally having had enough, makes a wish: “I wish you two would stay in your fishbowl for the rest of the day and stop bothering me!” Having to grant Timmy's wish, they turn into fish and settle underwater for the day.

Timmy then takes the Godparents to school for the day, but he forgets and leaves them on the bus! The bus then drives to Vicky's high school where Vicky finds them! What luck! She had forgotten that she was supposed to bring a pet to science class today. It's “dissection” day! And these two fish will come in handy!! Since the Godparents have to remain as fish for the rest of the day, it's up to Timmy to rescue them before Vicky's class starts!

“TRANS-PARENTS” - Timmy is terrified! He's just gotten his worst report card ever! He can't understand it! He studied his little pink hat off! How could this have happened?! And - to make matters worse - he's got to bring his parents to school for a parent/teacher conference with Mr. Crocker to discuss his terrible grades!! But, Cosmo and Wanda offer to come to his rescue and disguise themselves as Timmy's parents! Great idea! “POOF!” They become parent-sized and suddenly have no powers for twelve hours!! Why? “Da Rules” say that if a Godparent walks the earth as a human, they must live as one! The Godparents have no idea how to control their new human bodies and, with no powers, they have to do everything completely on their own. This makes for some interesting situations as Timmy and the Godparents try to fool the ever-suspicious Mr. Crocker!

"DISCO DORK" - The big school "Disco Theme" dance is coming up! Tootie wants Timmy to take her, but Timmy would rather ask Trixie to go. Yet, he's got two problems:

1. He can't dance.
2. Trixie wouldn't go with him if he were coated in money.

So the Godparents put Timmy through a quick disco dance program and conjure up a killer John Travolta outfit for him! Wham! He's suddenly king of the dance floor!

But, since his platform shoes and cool threads make him look...well...not like him, nobody knows it's actually Timmy amazing everyone! Trixie quickly falls for this mystery dancer, but, so does Vicky who has been chaperoning the dance! Timmy now has to escape the older more experienced clutches of Vicky and get to Trixie before the dance ends and his wardrobe vanishes along with his dance abilities.

"INSPECTION DETECTION" - Timmy and his best pals - Chester and A.J. - are all playing "Dungeons and Dragons" in Timmy's room. The Godparents - in their fish disguises - discreetly inform Timmy that the "Godparent Inspector" is coming and that, in order to keep their jobs, they have to impress him with the way they help Timmy on a daily basis. They also inform Timmy that he's coming any second now, and that he better get rid of his friends so they don't see anything they shouldn't.

But, Chester and A.J. - geeks to the max - and smart, observant geeks at that - are in the middle of their game and will not be interrupted at any cost! Timmy must then scrupulously juggle keeping the guys distracted *and* having Cosmo and Wanda perform all sorts of tricks for him to impress the inspector!

"SELF DEFENSE" - Bruno Delvecchio - the school bully - is harassing Timmy, Chester and A.J. yet again. Timmy's had enough. The Godparents offer to turn Timmy into a Super-Ninja, but he wants to learn to defend himself on his own! Besides, Chester and A.J. don't have Godparents and it wouldn't be fair.

He decides that they're all gonna sign up for the "V". School of self-defense! Thinking that "V" means something cool like, "Viper" or "Vengeance" the boys are disheartened to learn that the "V" stands for "Vicky". Yep. Vicky. She actually tells the guys she can teach them self-

defense. Having nowhere else to turn, they go for it. Vicky then put them through a Pat Morita-type "Karate Kid" workout: they wax her parents car, they paint her house, they mow her lawn, do her laundry, etc.

When the guys are done, Vicky's house looks great and the guys are exhausted. When they ask what they've learned, Vicky, says she doesn't care, she just got all of her chores done!

Depressed, they see Bruno coming. They then turn their newfound "Karate cleaning powers" - which are actually quite formidable - on him! They don't hurt the filthy punk, just clean him up from head to toe! He's terrified and runs screaming! Vicky, suddenly fearing these Ninjas she's created, is then scared into doing their bidding and washing all of their parent's cars, painting their houses, etc.

"I'VE GOT A SECRET!" - Mr. Crocker is on a mission: he's gonna get to the bottom of Timmy Turner's strange behavior if it's the last thing he ever does! This episode is unique because it tells a Fairly OddParents story without us ever actually seeing the OddParents and is told entirely from Mr. Crocker's point-of-view.

Mr. Crocker - again, like the principal from "Ferris Bueller" - suspects that Timmy is up to something. So, at the beginning of the school day, he decides to follow him. He follows him through recess, lunch, gym class, the lavatory, and even to his house after school! All the while catching glimpses of odd goings-on: Timmy amazingly scoring the winning basket in gym! Timmy scaring the class bully away! Timmy snagging the coveted first place in lunch line! And Timmy even doing his household chores without laying his finger on a single utensil or apparatus of any kind!

During all this, Crocker is attempting to document everything! Cameras, recording devices, even satellite imaging! Yet, sadly for him, everything goes wrong and he constantly winds up looking like the village idiot!

Little does he know that Timmy and the Godparents have been on to him from the very beginning and have been thwarting his efforts every step of the way!

EPISODE CATEGORIES -

What kind of stories will we be able to tell with these characters? Fair enough. Let's all wave our wands and have a look...

1. **Timmy/Godparents stories:** Timmy has a problem, he solves it with the help of the Godparents.
2. **Timmy stories:** Timmy's solo adventures in which the Godparents co-star. Not as magical helpers, just as other people in his life.
3. **Godparent stories:** Cosmo and Wanda's solo adventures in which Timmy only makes a brief cameo, yet contributes significantly to the episode.
4. **Godparent solo stories:** Godparents solo. In their fishbowl. In a mouse hole. Waiting for Timmy to get home from school. Whatever. Just the two of them being funny.
5. **Timmy/Vicky/OddParents stories:** Stories with the same core gang. Timmy needs help subverting Vicky, the Godparents are glad to oblige.
6. **Vicky stories:** Yes. Vicky stories. Let's see what makes her tick. And, yes, Timmy and the Godparents will figure prominently if we need them to.
7. **Timmy and the Incidentals:** Stories where Timmy interacts only with the incidental characters and the OddParents aren't seen at all.
8. **Timmy and his parents:** Stories centering heavily on Timmy's relationship with his parents. The Godparents showing up only when needed.
9. **The Fairy World:** Stories based entirely in the Fairy World in which Timmy is along for the ride.
10. **Ensemble stories:** Stories starring every frigging character, no matter how briefly. Timmy, Vicky, Cosmo, Wanda, Mom, Dad, Jorgen, Incidentals, etc. These stories could be definitely be twenty-two minutes.
