



THE MIDDLEMOST POST

More on this wackadoo place and its citizens later, we promise. For now, let's meet the unique and colorful characters that work for the Middlemost Post.




SERIES OVERVIEW:


CHARACTERS:

J.CLOUD (age...child)












Because of that dark expe-




A successful day for Parker is a day when he cheers up every single person he encounters on his daily route.

If your up for a peculiar shopping experience, stop by the Nowhere Store where you can't find a single thing your looking for.








The SIX TERRITORIES on Mt. Middlemost



It feels like Autumn all-year round here. Life's a little slower in this territory where you'll find some good old-fashioned folks eating some pretty keen sweet potato pie!






Volcanos, caves, mines, falling rocks, this place is dangerous and exciting! Lot of hot heads here with very short tempers.

TRAVEL TIP: That mushroom might look nice, but it will eventually EXPLODE!






This place is sparkling, stunning, and straight up weird. Be prepared to be stared at for an uncomfortable amount of time if you visit.

TRAVEL TIP: Don't agree to a personality test!


The SIX TERRITORIES on Mt. Middlemost






Granola tree huggers unite! The residents here take composting and recycling to the max. If you look closely, you can spot one in a treehouse wearing a Berkeley sweatshirt.

What Are Friends For?



The goal is to make exterior locations look and feel real while keeping the characters 2D and animated. This effect will be used sparingly, and could be done using CGI or actual models. Either way, it's gonna look awesome!
