On the strange, distant planet Zeenu, an assortment of creatures are gathered in a solemn ceremony as their Emperor addresses them. Suddenly the aliens notice an out of control rocket zigzagging through the sky and crashing into a house. The rocket's hatch opens and out comes ... **SHEEN ESTEVEZ** ... a hyperactive, manic, eccentric, overbearing, frantic, A.D.D. poster child currently taking the 4th grade for the third time. The Emperor is fascinated by this odd-looking alien and thinks Sheen is supremely intelligent and brave, since he came all the way to their planet on a "flying contraption" (that Sheen doesn't deny inventing). However, the evil Dorkus, whose house Sheen's rocket destroyed, wants to get rid of this pesky creature from Earth!

Dorkus sends Sheen to be executed at the Palace of Pain, by a brutal Zeenuian Alien Annihilator, but our boy manages to triumph. The Emperor offers him a job as the new Alien Annihilator, upsetting Dorkus even more! However, Sheen turns down the job because he wants to get home and catch the new tent-pole episode of Ultra Lord on TV. Sadly, his rocket is too badly damaged to fly. As he ineptly tries to fix it, he meets Princess Oom, the Emperor's giant daughter who has two actual faces, one on the front and one on the back. Oom immediately falls in love with Sheen and wants to marry him. Sheen is not thrilled with this prospect.

Dorkus, once again, tries to eliminate Sheen in the Valley of Unpleasant Holes, under the ruse of searching for a rare, dangerous creature, but our hero manages to escape. He discovers Nesmith, a brainy, talking chimp from the 60's space program who crashed on the planet years ago. He may be able to help Sheen fix his rocket and return to Earth! On their way to Sheen's rocket, they run into a terrifying monster, a Chocktow, who later turns out to be the pet of a pretty warrior girl with a wicked yodel, Aseefa. Sheen is smitten. She's really cute. Upon his returns to the palace, the Emperor, impressed by Sheen's exploits, grants Sheen a job title higher than Dorkus', enraging our villain.

WHAT'S THE SHOW ABOUT?

A very strange stranger in a strange land... A manic nutcase, who, for the first time in his life, is actually being taken seriously. Sheen makes it his mission to teach this planet the superior ways of Earth (albeit via the twisted mind of Sheen) and bring them into the 21st century (though possessing no skills to do such). We, the audience, get a look at the customs and ways of Earth as seen through the eyes of aliens and as taught by the least qualified person to do so. Sheen also has to deal with the strange customs and creatures of the planet, in addition to a jealous villain who wants to eliminate him, a crazed, giant Princess who wants to marry him, a cute blue girl who he likes and a brilliant astronaut-trained, talking chimp who wants to repair the rocket ship and return home to Earth... But until they do, there are plenty of adventures to be had as Sheen lives the dream of being an intergalactic space warrior cool guy.

CHARACTERS

NESMITH – a former NASA chimpanzee sent up in a spacecraft in the early 60's. He learned to speak while stranded on Zeenu for 40 some odd years. Way smarter and more sophisticated than Sheen, he tries to correct Sheen's many misconceptions about reality, but to his chagrin, finds that Sheen's ridiculous notions are always confirmed on the crazy place that is Zeenu. He desperately wants to fix the rocket, get back to Earth and have a banana.

DOPPY – Full name, Dopptholamew Doppweiller, an alien version of Carl Wheezer, Sheen's friend on *Jimmy Neutron*, but with green skin, four eyes and a slug-like body. Same Carl personality: mama's boy, shy, cautious, easily frightened, hypochondriacal, sensitive scapula, prone to randomly burst into song. He's also possibly dumber than Sheen. Sheen gets him into trouble. A lot.

EMPEROR – Pompous and grandiose, but also childlike and unpredictable, the Emperor thinks Sheen is amazing and brilliant and constantly seeks his advice and help. The Emperor is insatiably curious about this visitor from another planet and constantly pesters Sheen with questions about earth and its history, customs, etc. Sheen gives correct answers about .9% of the time, mostly he just makes the answers up.

DORKUS – The villain and all around bad guy. Furious that Sheen has destroyed his house and been given a prestigious job by the Emperor, Dorkus is always trying to "destroy" Sheen by sending him on dangerous missions, bringing hideous-alien-monster-creatures to Sheen's house, setting traps, giving Sheen faulty vehicles, etc. Sheen is oblivious to the fact that Dorkus wants to kill him, but by virtue of his own A.D.D. and crazed illogic, somehow always manages to make Dorkus's plots backfire.

PINTER – Dorkus's yes-man, fawning, genuflecting minion. An eyeball with wings, he flutters around Dorkus' head, complimenting his evil genius. plans. He often receives the brunt of Dorkus's anger when the latter's plans to eliminate Sheen fail.

ASEEFA – a member of the proud Glimmorian race; blue-skinned, with a ponytail that work as additional appendages. She's a tomboy who rides a giant beast, is adept at yodeling, and is a great warrior. She's very cute and quirky, and for both reasons, Sheen has a crush on her. The feeling may be mutual but neither acknowledges it.

PRINCESS OOM – One giant body. Two frightening faces. One face is like a cheerleader: bouncy, bubbly and ditzy. The other face, which is slightly more hideous, tries unsuccessfully to be seductive but just comes across as really intense. Oom is deliriously in love with Sheen and shows it by raffenhoffering (licking) him with her super long tongue. Sheen hates this more than anything. The Emperor thinks they're in love, which means Sheen can't stop her affections, though he'll do anything to avoid them.

PLANET ZEENU

Zeenu is a planet of limited technology resembling our own middle ages, but with bizarre alien animals that are used for transportation. Because this is not an advanced civilization, Sheen is able to impress them. They travel on creatures or use low-tech vehicles operated with pedals or steam power or lower creature power. The architecture is a mish-mash of styles.

A variety of geographical locations; valleys, oceans, mountains, deserts, rivers – all with a peculiar sci-fi twist; craters speak, rivers sing, volcanoes spew a tasty bi-carbonated drink every other day, etc.

The planet is populated by many different species of aliens with different levels of intelligence and types of personalities. Sheen has trouble keeping them all straight and who is good, bad, dangerous, poisonous, fun, etc. Then there are Chocktows and Fusterbeests, who are dangerous and will eat you, and flying elephant-like winged Agronomes that swoop through the sky, sucking people up with their trunks.

Doesn't Sheen miss his home, family and friends?

Yes, but remember Sheen's attention span has been clocked at .04 seconds, so whenever he feels homesick, there is always something colorful on the planet to distract him ... and it is kind of cool for him to be held in high regard and perceived as smart and heroic (for the first time). Also, the brilliant chimp, Nesmith, explains to Sheen that due to the time space continuum as far as "Earth time" goes, Sheen will only be gone for a total of 4 minutes, so no one will actually miss him. And that solves that problem!

How did Sheen get there?

Sheen snuck into Jimmy's laboratory looking for his rare Ultra Lord collectors card, saw a prototype rocket that had a big sign that said: "Sheen! Do Not Touch This Rocket!"... And ... well, you know the rest. All Sheen has with him from Earth is what he had in his pockets; lint, a seemingly endless supply of gum and his Ultra Lord collectors card which is torn up in the pilot. Sheen uses these items to his advantage when he thinks of it. Sheen is always asking the Zeenuians for Earth items (TV, guacamole, ice cream, skateboards, pizza, comic books, bubble gum, root beer,) and is surprised to find out the Zeenuians don't have it. Sheen then tries to make or re-create the Earth items and it never works and always turns into something else and/or causes some great calamity on the planet.

STORIES

“Is This Cute?”

The Emperor tries to prepare Sheen for a visit from Boh-Rok the Destroyer, the most powerful and horrible creature in all of Zeenu. To sabotage Sheen, Dorkus enlists the worst possible tutor, Doppy.

“Sheen For A Day”

Sheen accidentally gives Princess Oom the most important part of his rocket ship and has to find a way to get it back.

“Well Bread Man”

Seeing an opportunity to destroy Sheen, Dorkus volunteers to train him for the “Manhood Trial by Fire.”

“Cutting the Ultra-Cord”

Nesmith and Doppy are worried about Sheen’s erratic behavior. Dorkus suggests therapy by man-eating Fusterbeest.

“Boy Next Dorkus”

Dorkus vows revenge when his new next door neighbor Sheen upstages his elegant game night with a wild raging party.

“Joust Friends”

Princess Oom’s gigantic, two-headed ex-boyfriend, Grish the Beautiful, challenges Sheen to a battle of honor.

“What’s Up, Chock?”

Sheen and the guys infiltrate a vicious pack of Chocktows to help Aseefa find her missing pet, Chock-Chock.

“Trial by Jerry”

Sheen introduces the justice system to Zeenu when he has to defend Nesmith who has been accused of eating the Emperor’s favorite pet.

“Thanksgetting”

Sheen invents an “all get, no give” holiday that nearly destroys him.

“Keeping Up With the Gronzes”

Obsessed with setting world records, Sheen challenges competitive librarian acrobats to a book-stacking competition.

“Torzilla”

Sheen grows a tortilla monster that threatens the city.
